Who we are

This website is operated by Layla Parsons Ltd trading as Professionally Legal Solutions. We are a company registered in England and Wales under company number 09855874 of registered address 17 Spedan Close, London NW3 7XF.

We collect, use and are responsible for certain personal information about you. When we do so we are regulated under the <u>General Data Protection</u> <u>Regulation</u> which applies across the European Union and the United Kingdom and we are responsible as 'controller' of that personal information for the purposes of those laws.

Our website

- Any other personal information relating to purchasing a product online.

We use this personal information to:

- create and manage your account with us
- verify your identity

- provide goods and services to you
- customise our website and its content to your particular preferences

• notify you of any changes to our website or to our services that may affect you

• improve our services

This website is not intended for use by children (persons under the age of 18 years) and we do not knowingly collect or use personal information relating to children.

Our legal basis for processing your personal information

When we use your personal information we are required to have a legal basis for doing so. There are various different legal bases on which we may rely, depending on what personal information we process and why.

The legal bases we may rely on include:

• **consent:** where you have given us clear consent for us to process your personal information for a specific purpose

• **contract:** where our use of your personal information is necessary for a contract we have with you, or because you have asked us to take specific steps before entering into a contract

• **legal obligation:** where our use of your personal information is necessary for us to comply with the law (not including contractual obligations)

• **vital interests:** where our use of your personal information is necessary to protect you or someone else's life

• **public task:** where our use of your personal information is necessary for us to perform a task in the public interest or for our official functions, and the task or function has a clear basis in law

• **legitimate interests:** where our use of your personal information is necessary for our legitimate interests or the legitimate interests of a third party (unless there is a good reason to protect your personal information which overrides our legitimate interests)

We will share personal information with law enforcement or other authorities if required by applicable law.

Whether information has to be provided by you, and if so why

We may require you to provide name, address, email address, delivery address etc to enable us to provide the services you have purchased or ordered from us. We will inform you at the point of collecting information from you, whether you are required to provide the information to us.

The impact of our use of your personal information

We may store it for liability purposes and/or tax but will not share it with 3rd parties unless by legal obligation.

Transfer of your information out of the UK and EEA

We will not transfer your personal information to countries located outside the United Kingdom (UK) and European Economic Area (EEA) unless by prior consent- for example we are working with a client who has sister companies abroad or a contract with a country abroad.

Cookies and other tracking technologies

A cookie is a small text file which is placed onto your device (eg computer, smartphone or other electronic device) when you use our website. We use cookies on our website. These help us recognise you and your device and store some information about your preferences or past actions.

Marketing
